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Dear Competitor,

Thank you for your entry to the VSCC meeting at Shelsley Walsh on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> of July. Your Competitor's Entry Pack includes details of your entry including your competition number and your paddock allocation together with a paddock plan, car pass and wristbands (2 per entry) that will allow you access to the venue. If you require further entry passes, please purchase these via our website or contact the VSCC head office who will be able to let you buy them at a discounted rate.

There have been some changes to procedure at Shelsley Walsh over the last 12 months so you might need to note the following:

- 1. For those who would like to arrive on Friday, you may do so at any time from 9am. You will be able to unload in the paddock if you so choose.
- 2. We will open for signing-on on Friday at 3.30pm until 6pm at the paddock office for those who wish to avoid the early morning paddock office queue on Saturday.
- 3. We now have permanent numbers for the garages that will help you to locate your spot prior to your arrival, by checking it against the paddock plan supplied. Please do not confuse your competition number with your garage allocation. Your competition number will NOT correspond with the garage number, so please check this carefully.
- 4. We now have a one-way entry and exit system in the Competitor's car park. Church drive is the exit from the paddock to the Competitors car park and the return from the Competitors' car park to the paddock is via the exit gate in the Competitors' car park, straight across into the Orchard, then follow the new road back to the paddock.
- 5. We now have fresh water supply, fresh water wash basins and flushing toilets situated in the Orchard, opposite the entrance to the Competitors' car park. It's a big blue unit that you will not be able to miss. This will be open 24 hours a day over the weekend.
- 6. If you intend to stay overnight in a motorhome or tent, you will need to purchase a Camping Pass for £10 when you sign on and display it on your vehicle or tent so that this can be checked by our team when they make their inspections during Saturday and Sunday.

Dogs are allowed in the Competitors car park field but not on the other side of the road or in the paddock, unless the meeting has finished.

We very much hope that you have an enjoyable time and wish you a safe and successful weekend in the glorious Worcestershire countryside.

#### **IMPORTANT**

#### PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING CHANGES/ALTERATIONS FOR 2017

- 1. Practice and competition will take place in programme order or as advised by the Clerk of the Course
- 2. There will be no requirement to 'book' batches
- 3. Scrutineering will take place in programme order
- 4. Please be with your car when the scrutineers arrive at your paddock locations
- 5. Those in Batch 1 will need to sign on as soon after 8am as possible.
- 6. Any car that is unable to start in the correct order or batch may be given the opportunity to practice later subject to any time constraints

ARRIVAL Competitors can arrive at any time from 9am on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June. Please note that Saturday is a Practice Day and Sunday will be for Competitive runs. Competing cars which are not road legal should be unloaded in the Paddock before parking your Trailer in the Competitors' Car Park. Tender vehicles may be brought into the Paddock for unloading tools or spares only, and must then be REMOVED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE to the Competitors' Car Park (Gate I). Due to restrictions of space, only Competing Cars will be permitted to remain in the Paddock. Please enter via Gate A and exit via Church drive opposite.

PLEASE NOTE THAT A NEW 1-WAY SYSTEM HAS BEEN INTRODUCED. A new Competitors Car Park Exit gate has been installed half way along the field. At the end of a meeting NO TRAILERS will be allowed to go UP Church Drive by the Lodge in order to access the paddock. If you need to access the paddock with your trailer then please use the new road that is opposite the new EXIT gate mentioned above, cross the road into The Orchard and follow the new road to the bottom paddock gate and NOT blocking Church Drive.

<u>CAMPING</u> The Camping Area for motorhomes, caravans and tents is also located in the Competitors' Car Park (Gate I). Competitors will need to purchase a Camping pass when signing on if they wish to stay overnight in the car park. These passes will be checked during the weekend

**SIGN-ON** at the Paddock Office 3.30pm until 6pm on Friday and from 8.00am on Saturday. You will need to collect your scrutineering slip at signing on. Competitors will need to show:

- Competition Licences
- Championship registration cards
- Club membership cards

Wristbands must be worn and will be inspected.

**SCRUTINEERING** starts at 8am and finishes no later than 3.30 pm. Only cars passed by the Scrutineer, with competition numbers in place, will be allowed to practice.

**NUMBERS** must be displayed on both sides and the front (facing/angled to the near side) of your car. For the convenience of competitors, a limited supply of self-adhesive numbers will be available for sale at the Paddock Office.

**PRACTICE** starts at 9am. Your batches are shown on the enclosed timetables. Listen to the Paddock tannoy for your batch call or as advised by the paddock marshals.

**FINISH PADDOCK** After completing your run, park as directed by the marshals and remain near your car until the signal to return down the Hill is given. Times will be available in the hut in the Finish Paddock. **When descending, no flags will be shown but speed must be moderated, drivers must be prepared to stop if a red flag is shown.** Cars descending the Hill will turn right at the Triangle (above the start line) and return to the Paddock via the Return Road. No stopping or overtaking on the course is permitted. All protective clothing must be worn while descending the hill at the end of a batch in accordance with the latest MSA instructions and the Blue Book regulations.

#### PLEASE DO NOT STOP IN THE RETURN ROAD BETWEEN TRIANGLE AND THE CHURCH.

**<u>DUAL ENTRIES</u>** The first driver to run will return directly to the Start Area so as to allow the second driver to run as near as possible with the remainder of the class.

#### **GENERAL**

ANY COMPETITOR DRIVING UP THE HILL IN ANY VEHICLE OUTSIDE THE OFFICIAL PRACTICE PERIOD MAY BE EXCLUDED FROM THE MEETING.

**OFFICIAL NOTICES AND PROVISIONAL RESULTS** will be displayed on the notice board by the Timing Display Hut.

INDIVIDUAL TIMES AND TRAP SPEEDS are available via the computers based in the Timing Display Hut in the paddock

<u>WASTE OIL</u> A tank is provided for the disposal of any waste oil. The Paddock Office staff will advise the location. Please do not tip any waste oil in any other area or on the grass.

<u>MEDICAL</u> It is important to compete with an empty bladder and mouth (i.e. gum, sweets, dentures). Glasses should be shatterproof.

RESULTS will be on the notice board at the end of the meeting and emailed or posted to competitors after the event.

<u>WARNING</u> The Police have warned the Club that they will not hesitate to prosecute any competitor obstructing the public highway by loading or parking trailers or vehicles in the road at the end of the meeting.

COMPETITORS ARE REMINDED THAT TRAILERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED INTO THE PADDOCK TO LOAD CARS WHILST THE MEETING IS IN PROGRESS.
