

COMPETITORS' INSTRUCTIONS

I. Introduction

Many thanks for entering this year's Vintage Welsh Rally. You will find enclosed all of the information you require at this stage to compete on this event, including the entry list and route hand-out times.

- SR5 Membership for the remainder of the calendar year is available at signing on for non-member navigators only. This membership is restricted as detailed in the Committee's Resolution of 16 May 2001. All drivers must be able to produce a valid club membership card.
- SR19(d)R11.1 Manned controls will open 15 minutes before the due time of car 1 and close 41 minutes after the due time of the last car.SR22 (add)Competitors are reminded of
 - a) H.32.1.5. (ROADWORTHYNESS) An entrant shall, before the event, satisfy himself as to the eligibility and safety of the vehicle and safety equipment and the competence of its driver.
 - b) H.32.1.6. (ROADWORTHYNESS) An entrant shall furthermore ensure that a vehicle is maintained in an eligible and safe condition throughout the event or meeting.
 - c) H32.1.7. (ROADWORTHYNESS) The act of presenting a vehicle and safety equipment for official scrutiny shall be deemed a declaration of its fitness and eligibility for the event and an acceptance of the consequences of such a declaration not being valid.

6. Non Starters

If you find that you are unable to start the event please advise Gemma Price, Secretary of the Meeting as soon as possible at the Club Office on 01608 644777 ext 4 until 12 noon on Friday 11 October. After this time please call mobile number 07734 030999.

7. Trailers

Please note the use of trailers to and from the event is permitted, however the use of trailers during the event is not permitted. There is parking for all non-competing cars and trailers at the start venue. Please ensure you follow the instructions of the Marshals and park neatly.

8. SATURDAY FILTER POINT OR MARSHAL OR COLLECT PENALTIES

New for 2013 we are asking all Competitors (one crew member per competing car) to chose to either MARSHAL, visit a FILTER POINT or accrue PENALTIES. The choice is yours!

If you would like to **MARSHAL** on the trial please contact the Competitions Department to volunteer. When you arrive at your allocated hill to marshal you need to tell your Hill Chief that you are competing on the Rally and they will give you a ticket to prove you have marshalled. Dont lose this ticket, as you will need to produce it at Signing On on Sunday morning in order to avoid penalties.

Or

If you decide you dont want to Marshal or complete the 100 miles, you will accrue **PENALTIES** in accordance with SR7.

Or

If you decide you would like to complete the 100 MILES and visit FILTER POINT you require the following information.

Filter points open at 09.30, competitors must report to Presteigne before 14.00. Please be sure to plan your route so as to pass through one of the filters in good time. Filter points can be regarded as a turning point. The mileage requirement is for the car it is not mandatory for the crew, but note that the filter point / turning point evidence must be presented at Presteigne (e.g till receipt to prove full distance has been covered). The filter point locations are as below.

Central Filter	The Old Rectory, Alderton, Gloucestershire, by kind permission of VSCC member, Bob Jones. In the village of Alderton, just off the A438 near Prescott. This is Bob's private home. MR 150/SP 003 331
Southern Filter	At Pengethley Garden Centre on A49, approx 3 miles west of the roundabout on A40 at Ross on Wye. MR 162/SO 542 255

DONT FORGET TO COLLECT YOUR EVIDENCE

- 1. GET A START RECEIPT this needs to show the time and date on it, we suggest you buy a newspaper or similar from a local corner shop
- 2. VISIT A FILTER POINT from the list above and collect your 'visited' card
- 3. TURINING POINT? should the Filter Point you have visited not be sufficiently far enough away to ensure you have completed 100 miles (this is measured by string over a map, point to point, rather than road mileage) add a Turning Point to your route by collecting another Receipt
- 4. THE RADNORSHIRE join the Filter Point Checking Queue, and assuming you have done enough mileage, you will be given a Filter Card.

Please do not lose your 'Marshalled' or 'Filter' Cards overnight, as these are required to be handed in at Signing On during Sunday morning in order to avoid having penalties applied.

9. Arrival at Event & Registration Procedures

Scrutineering will take place Sunday morning as you enter the Car Park at Wents Meadow, please remember to display a valid tax disc for the car entered and also bring your Laminated Buff Passport (not required for Class 4 – Champagne). Once you have passed Scrutineering you will be given a Process Card, please take this card to Signing On inside the Scout Hut. At Signing On both you and your Navigator(s) must sign on. Non-member Navigators are required to complete the form at the end of these Instructions and hand it in to the Signing On team. You will then be issued with Additional Instructions and your competition numbers. Please fix your competition numbers to your car where the Marshals will be able to read them as you approach/depart a Time Control (i.e. nearside of the vehicle). **If you competed on any VSCC Rallies this year, please bring your rally plate with you!**

10. Map Editions & Navigators Equipment

Please ensure you bring with you the following equipment:

- Ordnance Survey Landranger Map 148 Edition <u>B2</u>
- Competitors should note that the route will not plot correctly on any other edition of this map
- Roamer
- Basic Pencil Case including pencils and eraser
- Rally Plate (if previously issued at a VSCC Rally in 2013)

Competitors are reminded that the use or evidence of fitment of post-1940 computer or calculating machines or Smart Phone used to measure distances or average speeds in any form are forbidden and will result in instant disqualification. The use of Halda Speedpilots and Tripmasters or any other similar equipment is specifically banned. Competitors are further reminded that digital stopwatches, clocks and all other readout/display devices are not permitted to be attached to the car in any way, failure to comply with this regulation may result in exclusion.

II. Petrol

Petrol is available in Presteigne from the Roberts Family Garage on the High Street, should the garage be closed, simply call the number in the window and assistance will arrive.

14. Route Instructions

All Competitors will be given the same basic route instructions, although Class 4 entrants (Champagne Class) will have additional/simplified instructions. Route instructions will be issued from the Scout Hut. Individual times for route collection vary so please see the detailed schedule at Signing On.

15. Average Speeds

The average Speeds used on this event will be as follows: Speed Category I (Fast) = between 18-24 mph

Speed Category 2 (Slow) = between 16-24 mph

16. Insurance

Individual Third Party Car Insurance

The Club has applied to **Lockton** for a Blanket Cover Note under the **Motor Sports Road Traffic Scheme**. This will provide Competitors who need to use the Scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the Event. The basic rate for the Event will be £22.28. New applicants wishing to use the Scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Lockton Declaration:-

- Over 21 and Held a Full Licence for at least 6 months.
- Not more than I fault accident in the last 3 years.
- No more than maximum of 6 speeding points on licence.
- No physical or mental disabilities.
- No other material facts.

If you are able to comply with all the points above simply sign on the Signing On Form and pay the premium to obtain Insurance under this scheme – No Letter of Acceptance will be issued. If you are unable to comply with any of the above points you may be able to get cover but you must complete a Declaration Form which is available from the VSCC office (apply to the Secretary of the Meeting) and forward direct to Lockton prior to the Event to allow sufficient time for Letter of Acceptance to be issued. Faxed copies are acceptable.

17. Safety

The correct rally route is reasonably hazard free, but there are some areas that could be difficult to pass. It is impossible to judge the level of use by other road users, and so that our sport should not cause offence, we have to stress the importance of care to others, be they motor vehicles, agricultural equipment, horses, cyclists, pedestrians, local property owners or even fellow competitors. Competitors are asked to take particular care on narrow sections of road.

18. Passing

In the event of a faster car catching a slower competitor it is expected that the slower car will pull over as soon as possible to enable the faster car to pass as he may well be running at a higher average speed or is trying to regain time after a mistake. This is considered to be sporting behavior. This also applies to members of the public who should not be inconvenienced.

IMPORTANT NAVIGATIONAL INFORMATION

Route Instructions

All Competitors will be given the same basic route instructions, although Class 4 entrants (Champagne Class) will have additional information added. Route instructions for the first half will be issued from the Signing On location and the second half issued from the car park of the Horse & Jockey. Individual times for route collection vary so please see the detailed schedule at Signing On.

Plotting Time

Experts will get 10 minutes plotting time, Semi-Experts will get 20 minutes and the Novice and Champagne Classes will get 30 minutes to plot. To work out your start time add your competition number to 09.30 for the first half and 13.30 for the second half. So car no 23 will start the first half at 09.53 and the second half at 13.53.

Shortest Route

The shortest route that takes into account all the route instructions within a section always applies. A tip – always read all the instructions within a section before plotting.

Order of Instructions

Instructions will always be in order and read from left to right unless otherwise stated.

Map References

These are always measured to the bottom left hand corner of a feature. Compass points before / after a map reference means 'approach from / depart to' the point specified eg NW123456S means 'approach 123456 from the north-west and leave heading south''.

Each section of the route finishes with a map reference so that even if you cannot follow the instructions you have a point of reference to aim for. Sometimes if you cannot follow the instructions forwards it helps to go the end of the section and work backwards.

Give Ways

MSA regulations require competitors to **STOP** at all junctions en route that are protected by 'Give Way' signs. Competitors should assume that a Give Way sign is present at each change of road classification / colour including wide and narrow yellow roads. A list of Give Ways, which may be on the correct route, will be supplied at Signing-On. You may wish to plot them before starting.

PR

Much PR work has been undertaken in order for the rally to take place. It is vital that competitors drive in such a fashion that will not bring the vintage car movement into disrepute. Please respect land owners and other road users, particularly cyclists, walkers and horse riders.

Warning Signs

There will be various VSCC signs en route. These will be kept to a minimum but please do act on them – they are for your benefit and are important. **NO** boards may be placed on certain junctions, do not pass them, they are there to prevent you following an incorrect route. Boards saying **CARE!** mean competitors should exercise caution as there is some hazard ahead – often a junction with restricted visibility. Boards reading **BUMPS!** are self-explanatory and are to help preserve your suspension / person!

Timing

Timing will be by marshals' hand held synchronised clocks. There will be a master clock available at the start to enable you to synchronise your own watch. Scheduled Timing will be used. The time recorded will be the time that the car stops at the control. Competitors early or late at a control should aim to be an equal amount early or late of time at the next control, for which no further penalty will be applied. Should you lose further time or make up time you will be penalised at the next time control.

Time Controls will open 15 minutes before car 1 is due and close 30 minutes after the due time of the last car.

Each Time Control will display a OTL Time Board for both Speed Categories, this is to help you ensure you remain within your Maximum Permitted lateness, simply add your car number to the time displayed for your Speed Category. If you are later than the time you calculate you will need to 'cut route' in order to get back within lateness.

Average Speeds

The average Speeds used on this event will be as follows: Speed Category I (Fast) = between 18-24 mph

Speed Category 2 (Slow) = between 16-24 mph

Controls & Boards

There are two types of boards used in this rally:-

- (a) Time Controls Boards (TCs). These are at Time Controls where Competitors must stop, and they will be manned by marshals who will enter the time you arrive on your Time Card and whether or not you are travelling in the correct direction. TC's will be undisclosed except for the start controls in the morning and afternoon. Timing is to the previous whole minute.
- (b) Route Boards (RBs). These are white, A4 sized boards placed on the verge at the left hand side of the road. Each board will have VSCC identification, the number of the board (RB1, RB2 etc) and a code word. The code word should be copied exactly into the correct space on your Time Card to prove you have been past it.

Baulking

It is a longstanding custom in rallying that any car that catches another should be allowed to pass. Any competitor not complying with this will be considered unsporting. Therefore, should another car catch you, you must let it pass as soon as reasonably possible, minimising any delay in its progress.

Loitering

Until braking to stop at the control, a car must not slow distinctly after spotting the control in a deliberate attempt to arrive in the control at a later minute. If this practice is witnessed, the **L** marker should be circled by the Marshal on your Timecard.

1. At any event organised by the VSCC for which the MSA regulations require those involved to have the minimum qualification of club membership there will be available the opportunity to become a member of the Vintage Sports-Car Club Limited, commencing on the day upon which the event is due to start, and ceasing on the next 31st December, the date upon which the club's membership subscription falls due for the ensuing year.

2. Candidates will be required to state their full name and home address including postcode, and to sign an application for membership in which they undertake to abide by the rules of the Club and be subject to the provisions of the Memorandum and Articles in the same way as members joining on an annual basis, except that their membership is limited to the balance of the current calendar year.

3. Candidates will be required to identify the competition number of the car in which they are to compete. The Directors regard this as an introduction of the candidate by the undersigned and, subject to any demur by the Stewards of the event, hereby resolve that the candidate is admitted as a member of the Club at the commencement of the event for a period of the balance of the current calendar year and is inscribed in the register of the company's members.

4. The Directors may levy any subscription or entrance fee in respect of short-term membership as they see fit. As a result the recipient of this category of membership will not be entitled to receive or benefit from any Club publications and/or other services that are offered to fully paid-up Club members.
