

## The London Rally Marked Map

A speciality of historic rallying, often used on night sections, is the London Rally Section, named after the famous rally that was most associated with this method of route presentation in the 1950/60s.

*Note: it has nothing to do with a London A-Z map!*

Prior to starting the night section you will receive a colour photocopy from an OS map, with numerous labelled points which you can transfer to your own map if you wish. You will also receive a schedule indicating which points to visit, with some approach and departure direction information allowing you then to plot the correct route. You may also be told to not visit some points to give you the correct route.

As an example, you may receive instructions in this format:

From point A, take the shortest route via the following points in the order given on coloured roads only :
