The grid is fundamentally split into two to cater for stripped racing cars and road going sport cars, where each is split into a further 5 classes based on engine capacity and other variables such as non-standard wheel sizes. As well as points being scored for overall race results there are also many more points up for grabs as class results, along with biggest contributor in the paddock, most consistent driver (not necessarily the fastest) also all counts towards it! also the person who best demonstrates the spirit of the VSCC Specials Grid. With so many of these variables this leads to some extremely close results at the end of the year and it really is anyone's game.

The Williams Trophy is a magnificent Art Deco trophy, , won by 'Williams' for his victory in the first ever Monaco Grand Prix in 1929 and presented, by his widow, to the Bugatti Owners' Club in the 1970s and raced for ever since. The inaugural win was achieved by William Charles Frederick Grover, racing under the pseudonym 'Williams', at the wheel of a Bugatti Type 35B, a supercharged version of Ettore Bugatti's seminal Type 35 but with a 2.3 litre, straight eight engine, so it seems appropriate that the majority of post-Monaco victories have been taken by Bugattis. The race is open to two seater Grand Prix cars prior to 1935 and wins by other makes have included Christopher Mann's Alfa Romeo Monza that is entered again today. Amongst the Bugattis, three Type 35Bs will be hoping to uphold the 'Williams, tradition and they will face opposition from unsupercharged Type 35s including Duncan Pittaways very fast example, a possible contendor for outright victory. Often winners in the past in the hands of the likes of Martin Morris, Sir john Venables-Llewelyn and Charles Dean, the twin cam Type 51 will be represented today by race sponsor, Tim Dutton, in his distinctive red and black example. Other marques include Frazer Nash and MG with Teifion Salisbury's K3 and the Nurburg Nash of Adam Smith

There are several GNs, the precursor to Frazer Nash, on the entry list, including the very original Touring GNs of Richard Parsons, Justin Maeers & Dougal Cawley, Bill Rosten's GN 11.9 'Annie', as well as the GN Specials of Rob Moore, another Ford-engined car, and that of Mark Walker, the latter of whom won the slower grid last year in his infamous V-twin engined GN, 'Thunderbug', with its cylinders taken from a WW1 aircraft's radial engine. There are again several Super Sports, running closer to original spec Meadows engines, with Nash clutches as opposed to the more modern Borg & Beck clutches being used in the faster race; a lovely example being the 1925 Anzani belonging to Club Secretary Jane Arnold-Forster, the very pretty 1931 FN Ulster of Charles Pither, and a handful of TT Replicas.
