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This is the inaugural running of the VSCC North Norfolk Tour, and we will drive the big skies and beautiful landscapes of the North of this rural county, dominated by Palladian estates and statement Churches built on the profits of the 15th century wool trade. However, everywhere in this quiet and rural landscape there are the remains of a frenetic and action-packed era when Norfolk was the home to many RAF and USAAF airfields taking part in the titanic air-battles of World War II.

Following a 85-mile route marked by memorials to long-disused but not forgotten airfields, we will take in quiet lanes, flint churches and charming villages. Along the way we'll have a picnic stop at Sennowe Park – home to the 'Cook's Tours' family and visit the world's leading restorer and expert on vintage De-Havilland aircraft.

The tour will begin and end with refreshments at the picturesque coastal village of Blakeney.

Supplementary Regulations

1. **Announcement.** The Vintage Sports-Car Club will organise a Touring Assembly on Sunday 6th July 2025, starting and finishing at **Blakeney Garage, 4 Morston Road, Blakeney, NR25 7AY.**

2. **Regulations.** The meeting will be held under the National Competition Rules of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) insofar as they apply to Touring Assemblies, these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for this event. A Certificate of Exemption number will be obtained from Motorsport UK and will be displayed at the start.

3. **Officials.** Secretary of the Meeting is Mark Davenport, who can be contacted with any questions at tel: 07970 534182.

4. **Vehicle eligibility.** The event is open to cars made before 1 January 1952 and driven by members of the Organising Club and the following invited club(s): the Sunbeam, Darracq, and Talbot Register. Cars do not need to have a VSCC 'Buff Form' eligibility document.

5. **Entering the Event.** Entries open on the publication of these Regulations and close on Sunday 29th June. The maximum entry will be 30 cars, the minimum will be 10. The entry fee is £45 per car. A reminder that the Club's Refund Policy applies to tours and any entries withdrawn after close of entries will be subject to a 50% Charge and any entries withdrawn after Thursday 3rd July will be charged the full amount. A copy of the Club's Refund Policy can be found [here](#).

6. **The Road Book.** Full Joining Instructions will be issued approximately one week prior to the event. A Road Book will be issued on the day, providing full and easy-to-follow navigational instructions and information about local places of interest.

7. **Registration.** On the Day Registration is from 09:00am until 10:00am, with cars leaving from 10:00am. Scrutineering is limited to ensuring the vehicle is eligible for the event. It is the entrant's responsibility to make sure their car is roadworthy. All cars must be insured for the public highway. It is recommended that all cars carry a serviceable fire extinguisher. All crew members must 'Sign On'. Anyone travelling in the car must be able to be properly seated in the car.

8. **Route.** The total distance covered will be approximately 85 miles. The start and finish location will be Blakeney Garage, 4 Morston Road, Blakeney, NR25 7AY.

Please note that parking is very limited at the Garage, but ample parking will be available close by at Blakeney Village Hall Carpark, Langham Road, Blakeney NR25 7PJ.

9. **Driving Standards.** Horses, cyclists, walkers and inconsiderate drivers can be expected at many places along the route. Do please give them the appropriate consideration. All drivers are reminded that they should abstain from the consumption of alcohol or drugs during the event.

10. **Lunch.** There will be a planned lunch stop at Sennowe Park. Participants are advised to bring a picnic lunch.

11. **Finish.** At the finish all drivers must report to the organisers to sign a Damage Declaration Form. Crews are expected to return to the start/finish from approx 3.30pm onwards where teas and cakes will be served.

12. **Trailers.** Overnight trailer parking is available at Church Farm, The Street, Wiveton, Holt, Norfolk, NR25 7TJ. This is approximately two miles from the start/finish location.

SAFETY, HEALTH, ENVIRONMENT AND FIRE (SHEF) AT THE VINTAGE SPORTS-CAR CLUB (VSCC) AND DURING VSCC EVENTS

It is the Policy of the Vintage Sports-Car Club (the Club) to operate in a positive culture of safety, health, and environmental protection throughout its entire business and sporting activities. To this end, the Club will coordinate all relevant activities under the collective heading of Safety, Health, Environment and Fire, or 'SHEF'.

The Club fully recognises the potential risks in its activities, the application of relevant legislation, and that it has the ultimate legal responsibility in these matters both in the workplace and at the Club's events. Accordingly, the President accepts overall responsibility for policy formulation and effective implementation of that policy. In turn, all employees, competitors, officials, and volunteer helpers are responsible for all SHEF duties allocated to them, either directly, or as a result of the Club's SHEF policy. Members of the public at Club events, whether paying or not, will be advised of their responsibilities as a result of their decision to spectate.

In pursuance of this policy, the Club will progressively identify all hazards and take measures to reduce risk. Motor Sport is spectacular and exciting, providing enjoyment to competitors and spectators alike, but there are many aspects of the sport which carry inherent risk. Much of this risk cannot be eliminated totally, and the emphasis must therefore be placed on controlling the risk through effective risk management systems. The purpose of such Risk Management will be elimination of the risk where possible, or to reduce the risk to levels which are demonstrably As Low As Reasonably Practicable (ALARP) where it cannot.

Throughout all of its activities, the Club will appoint an appropriate number of competent persons to implement the Club's SHEF procedures. In addition, a number of SHEF committees are established to ensure proper consideration of all risk factors. Committee members and other competent persons may be employees or volunteers. Competence will be guaranteed by formal training, the maintenance of records and, for motor sports events, full compliance with the rules and regulations of Motorsport UK (MSUK), the governing body of the sport in the UK, and the venue owners.
